D&T	<u>Workshop- Junk Modelling</u> The children will be learning how to use tools and materials in the junk modelling area. They will be exploring cutting different materials and will plan their own junk modelling creation. They will choose appropriate resources to create their own junk model.	<u>Textiles- bookmarks</u> Available from 7th November 2022. Pupils develop and practise threading and weaving techniques using various materials and objects. They look at the history of the bookmark from Victorian times versus modern-day styles. The pupils apply their knowledge and skills to design and sew their own bookmarks.	<u>Structures-boats</u> Available from 7th November 2022. In this unit, children explore what is meant by 'waterproof', 'floating' and 'sinking', then experiment and make predictions with various materials to carry out a series of tests. They learn about the different features of boats and ships before investigating their shape and structures to build their own.
Music	<u>Celebration music</u> Children will be learning about the music from a range of cultural and religious celebrations, including Diwali, Hanukkah, Kwankzaa and Christmas.	<u>Music and movement</u> Children come up with simple actions to well-known songs, learn how to move to a beat and express feelings and emotions through movement to music. <u>Musical stories</u> A unit based on traditional children's tales and songs. Moving to music with instruction, changing movements to match the tempo, pitch or dynamic of the piece; understanding that music and instruments can be used to convey moods or represent characters; playing an instrument as part of a group story.	<u>Exploring sound</u> Children explore how they can use their voice and bodies to make sounds, experiment with tempo and dynamic when playing instruments, identify sounds in the environment and differentiate between them <u>Big band</u> Learning about what makes a musical instrument, the four different groups of musical instruments, following a beat using an untuned instrument and performing a practised song to a small audience.
